Luke 24:1-35

1. What are the big things we usually hope for? Perhaps ask yourself where your mind often wanders.
2. Why?
3. The 2 disciples had unfulfilled hopes. How would reading Genesis 1-11 have helped them?¹
4. How does Christ's redemption challenge, reshape, affirm or supersede our hopes?
5. What scripture might Jesus have interpreted to them to show that the Christ should suffer and then enter his glory?²
6. Paul also followed this pattern. What does this teach us about the Christian life? cf. James 1:12.
7. Why does Luke make note that it was the first day of the week?

¹ Clue: the big problem with the world is sin, death, and the curse of God which we read about in Genesis 1-3. Also, the national story only begins at Genesis 12.

² The pattern is in David's life, and also Job. Joseph also had that pattern. Israel themselves had it in some way via Egypt's oppression. Where else can we see patterns of suffering and then glory?
