Questions for Homegroups

Jonah 1

- The story of Jonah and the fish is a vivid and memorable one. Why do you think so much of the Bible is written as narrative (approx. 40% of it)? Why is narrative so effective at communicating truths about God, ourselves and our world?
- Read over Jonah 1. What do we learn about Jonah here? How would you describe his relationship with God? Does that develop over the course of the chapter?
- What do we learn about the sailors? Contrast their actions with the actions of Jonah: who do you think comes across better? What is it that leads them to 'fear the LORD' by the end of the chapter (v.16)?
- What do we learn about God's dealings with his people here? What stands out for you about God's actions in this chapter? See e.g. vv.1-2, 4, 13-15.
- What do you want to remember from Jonah 1? Think of one thing you can take away from this study into the coming week.

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
